ATTENTION HISTORY BUFFS !



We recently became aware of the existence of a rare film. (Click that blue link!) It's called Ann Arbor Builds a New High School — a "home-made" movie that documents the three-year construction, the dedication, and the opening of Ann Arbor High (1953-56). The film is pretty interesting — especially if you're a history buff. You'll see many, many, well-known Ann Arbor citizens and school personnel from the days of our youth.

The film is 40 minutes long and narrated by physics teacher Mahlon Buell and Tappan principal Gene Maybee.

From the host website: In the early 1950s, Ann Arbor was far from a one-horse town, but there was only one public high school. And when the growth in the school district population occurred, a new high school was proposed and built on formerly U-M owned land in the outskirts of Ann Arbor at the corner of Main Street and West Stadium Boulevard, diagonally across from the Michigan Stadium. (The land was formerly a golf course.) Ground was broken for the new Ann Arbor High School, now AA Pioneer HS, on June 26, 1953.

If you don't want to watch all the construction details, just skip ahead to the scenes from Ann Arbor High's very first day & the dedication of the building (at 24:16 in). You'll glimpse a lot of teachers and kids you might remember. We sent the link to our former teachers a couple weeks ago and got a few comments about our brand new high school...

...OUR TEACHERS COMMENT ON "ANN ARBOR BUILDS A NEW HIGH SCHOOL"

From Science Teacher John Rosemergy:

"I'm so glad that I had an opportunity to see the film again after many years. It was good to see photos of old friends and colleagues. Principal Nick Schreiber wanted a film record of the construction. Paul Meyers and I were the chemistry teachers at the time. 1956, the year of occupancy of the new building, was the 100th anniversary of Ann Arbor High School. The school had been at the State Street site, in various buildings, since 1856. So there were two big school events to celebrate in 1956. Nick had a handsome bronze commemorative medallion struck in quantity for sale for a dollar or two."

From English Teacher Char Hanson:



"I started teaching there in the fall of 1958, and I always loved hearing stories of the move. My classroom was the room that had been built to be a coatroom — in fact it continued to be used as a coatroom for evening and weekend events. The amazing thing, of course, was that so soon after the opening, the building was overcrowded enough and the coatroom had to become a classroom."

From History Teacher Milo White:

"This film was shown at the 25th anniversary of Ann Arbor High School — I'm sure several times prior to that event and may be several times since then. Great history, and I highly recommend it."
