OUR "MAJOR PROJECTS" SO FAR:

- WEBSITE CREATION Our <u>website</u> is constantly changing. We are updating the classmate contact list, expanding the various pages' content, and adding photos & profiles.

It's called the *Ann Arbor High School Class of 1963 Alumni Association*. This was necessary in order to comply with the IRS and Michigan's tax laws in making us a tax-exempt entity. - REUNION LOCATION After debating lots of Washtenaw County potential venues for the reunion, we have found a spot that will be ideal for our big event. We'll be spending the evening of Saturday, July 13, 2013, at Washtenaw <u>Community College</u>. We have reserved a large section of WCC's excellent Morris Lawrence Building. It's a beautiful facility with moveable walls that will give us lots of flexibility for dining, dancing, relaxing, and hobnobbing.
