We invite all Classmates hitting town on Friday to join us in the lobby of the stunning Michigan Theater, 603 E. Liberty. If you haven't been there for 50 years or so, don't worry — it hasn't moved. (But just in case, you'll find a map & directions, here.) Under the guidance of CEO Russ Collins (Ann Arbor Huron High, '74) for the past 31 years, it has been restored to all of its original glory and was named the Outstanding Historic Theater in North America.

This reception — just for us — will be our first gathering place for Reunion Weekend. We'll enjoy Michigan Theater memories, the company of Classmates, snacks & refreshments, a cash bar, and of course, authentic Michigan Theater Popcorn. If it's been a while since you've been back to Ann Arbor, you're in for a real pleasure. It looks as elegant as it did on Opening Night, 1928! And, it'll be *just as cool a place* as it was in the summer of 1963!

After our reception (included with Registration) you have a nice chance to hang out with Classmates, go for a summer-night's walk around town, initiate a pub-crawl, or go to dinner. Within the four square blocks of downtown Ann Arbor there are over 60 restaurants & pubs.

But not only **THAT!** Listen to **THIS!** The 18th Annual "Rolling Sculpture Car Show" is taking over downtown Ann Arbor till 10PM! (It begins at 2:00.) So...right after our reception, you can walk outside, stroll down Liberty, meander around 4<sup>th</sup> Ave., Washington, & Main, and delight in inspecting more than 400 gorgeous cars & trucks. You don't have to be a car buff to love this stuff — *everybody* gets a kick out of this yearly downtown happening. Just take a look at this video from 2012 — you might see somebody you know!

WASHTENAW COUNTRY CLUB

The venue for our Reunion Golf Outing is a classy & historic (1899) course. Originally the Washtenaw Country Club, it is now known as The Polo Fields—Washtenaw. This venerable course is the third oldest in Michigan and was a golfing landmark long before we were born. It has always been famous for its beautifully designed holes & traditionally fast greens. Here's a 6-minute video tour of the full 18, done by Michigan Golfer TV. If you've never played there, here's part of the Club's own description: "6,512 yards of golf from the Blue Tees, par 72. Course rating: 74.2. Slope rating: 127 on Bentgrass...with narrow tree-lined fairways, well guarded & quick, undulating greens. Even though the length of the golf course is not overbearing, what it lacks in distance is made up with the importance of accuracy. The positioning of your tee ball & precision of your next shot are what make the course so difficult to master." In other words — it'll be a fun golfing challenge!

Green fees are \$50, and that includes a cart. (Rental clubs also available.)

### Michigan Stadium Tour

Saturday Morning 10:00 am



It's still the largest college stadium in the world — and even bigger than it was in 1963. We will have an up-close, inside look at this impressive landmark. It is something else! Quite a bit of Ann Arbor controversy accompanied this project — it seems that people either love it or hate it. Regardless of point-ofview, though, it's guaranteed to be fascinating. Here's why: we will visit the two towers that make up the press area and VIP Suites. We'll explore the Wolverines' locker room. We will even visit the amazing pizza kitchen that makes 10,000 pies each game day! We get to see it all - without the 110,800 fans that won't be there!

We'll meet at Gate One. That's the Tunnel entrance. We must be on our own for transportation to the Stadium, though. We can car pool, which should be pretty easy. Local Classmates can easily provide rides for those needing a lift. The Stadium tour does require a little walking. Everything is wheelchair accessible, though, and we'll have elevator access, too. The walk from the East to West Towers is about 10 minutes for the average Senior. And the walk from the field back to the parking lot is up a gradual hill — and it's a historic walk, done by more than a few stars, famous athletes, and quite a few Presidents. But don't worry — we can push wheel chairs and walk slowly if we get tired. After all, the Class of '63 sticks together!

As of today, 91 of us (there may be more yet to sign up) will meet at the Flagpole Entrance for this one. It could get a little bit emotional, since we all have so many memories of this place—mostly nice ones, let's hope.

The basic building is still recognizable, but there have been scores of structural changes throughout. Today's students have not just *two* gyms, but *two* swimming pools as well. But unlike us, they've only got *one* cafeteria — our old Rec Room. There's now a new staircase near the Clock Tower, and a bunch of new tennis courts out back, to the south.

The Pioneer principal is letting us use a special display case to show off some Ann Arbor High memorabilia from our era. We've even located copies of all the 1962-63 *Optimist* issues.

Our class established a lot of "firsts" at Ann Arbor High. It was students from the Class of '63 that made up the first Humanities Program, one of the few in the country back then, and now proud of its national reputation; the first high school Hockey Program was born our senior year; and our phenomenal swim team set a total of *15 records* at the 6A meet that winter!

This will be a tour of nostalgia and reminiscence ... sometimes a little bitter-sweet, perhaps, but all of it interesting and worthwhile!
